Research shows that each summer students who do not continue reading and practicing math lose, on average, 2-3 months of proficiency. In the case of reading, **students who do read can gain a month of proficiency.** Let's work together to ensure our students are successful!

Reading

- **REQUIRED:** Each child must read the required book for his/her class and complete the grade level book report form.

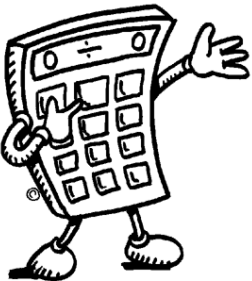


The book report will count as part of the first trimester grade for Reading/Literature, and the class will complete extension activities for the book in class. **The reading**

list is attached and the book report forms can be printed from the school's website under the "Students" tab.

- **ENCOURAGED:** We encourage students to read as much as possible this summer. Your goal is to read the equivalent of 10 books and fill out the "Summer Reading Log" sheet.

Each teacher has created a list of recommended titles (see "Recommended Reads" under the "Students" tab on the website) to assist you and your child in finding more reading materials.



MATH

- **ENCOURAGED:** Practicing math skills over the summer will also help your child prepare for school the next school year. All students have a subscription to IXL math, which you can access from home. You and your child can complete at least 10 math skills on IXL and fill out the "Math Practice Log" sheet.
